Notice to Fish Harvesters

2022 – CONSERVATION HARVESTING PLAN FOR THE SOUTHERN GULF OF ST. LAWRENCE BAIT FISHERY

Moncton, NB – June 24, 2022 – Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO) announces the Conservation Harvesting Plan (CHP) for the 2022 herring bait fishery in the southern Gulf of St. Lawrence in Herring Fishing Areas 16A to 16G. The bait fishery (**herring only**) will begin on July 4, 2022.

NEW IN 2022

Authorized species:

The bait fishing licence is only valid for herring.

Mandatory logbook for harvesters from the Gulf Region

DFO is reminding harvesters from the Gulf Region of the implementation of a mandatory logbook (paper format) for the commercial and bait herring fisheries in 2022.

Gulf Region harvesters must obtain the **Herring and Mackerel logbook - Fixed gear** from a prequalified supplier and must refer to the conditions of licence for compliance requirements. The list of prequalified suppliers is available at the following link:

Quebec Region harvesters must continue to use the electronic logbook.

OTHER MANAGEMENT MEASURES

Validity period

In 2022, herring bait licence conditions will be valid from July 4 to December 31.

Weekend closures

Weekend closures for all Herring Fishing Areas every week beginning at 12:00 Atlantic Daily Time (ADT) (noon) on Friday and ending at 12:00 (ADT) (noon) on Sunday.

Maximum weekly limit

The maximum quantity of herring authorized to catch and retain between Sunday at 12:00 ADT (noon) and the following Friday at 12:00 ADT (noon) is 2,270 kg in total.

Gear authorized

A maximum of 3 gillnets for a maximum total length of 50 fathoms with a minimum mesh size of 66.7 mm.

Fishing restrictions

It is strictly forbidden to sell any species of fish caught under the authority of a bait licence.

Hail-in

A hail-in of catch estimate is mandatory before entering port for fish harvesters from the Gulf Region. All licence holders will need to enter in an agreement with a dockside monitoring company prior to commencing the fishery.

Quebec Region harvesters must continue to use the electronic logbook.

Gear marking

Gear marking requirements are found in the bait licence conditions.

REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

Harvesters must refer to the conditions of licence for reporting requirements for items such as:

- Species at Risk
- Marine mammal interaction
- Lost gear reporting
- Retrieved gear reporting
